#### • Be a good person.

You are all practically adults and know the difference between right and wrong. If you are confused, ask me and I will let you know. However if you have to ask if something is considered good, the answer is probably no.

#### • Speak up.

## **Ensemble Description**

Marching band: The marching band is a large portion of our program here at LCHS and NGA. This ensemble is open to all students who wish to participate in grades 9-12. This ensemble rehearses on Tuesdays and Thursday afternoons, as well as, during the school day. This ensemble also requires travel to and from competitions and football games throughout the semester. Periodically throughout the semester, we will perform parades and in other venues for different events. This is a graded subject.

Concert Band: The concert band is the premier performing ensemble at LCHS and NGA. This ensemble is open to all students who wish to participate in grades 9-12. This ensemble rehearses only during the school day. Placement in this ensemble is a result of chair auditions during the school year. This ensemble may travel to concert festival in the Spring of each year and hosts a minimum of 2 concerts (Winter, and Spring.)

**Jazz Band:** The jazz band is a voluntary group and consists of drum set, auxiliary percussion, bass guitar, piano, trumpets, trombones, and saxophones. Other instruments may be added at the director's discretion. This ensemble meets after school in the spring and is intended to be a high energy fun event. This group will perform at special concerts during the Spring semester.

**Other Ensembles:** Other ensembles such as (Small Jazz combo, Quintets, Pep Band, and Percussion ensembles, Winter Percussion, Winter Guard) may be available to you and this information will be distributed as details are ironed out.

## Travel Protocols

Ensembles will travel to numerous locations over the next year. As a result, in order to be eligible for travel, students must file all forms within this handbook and submit them before travel. All rules and policies of the school system apply even during an off campus event. You are my responsibility and therefore I have zero tolerance for misbehavior while we are away, on the road, and representing our school. If I feel you are not conducting yourself appropriately, I reserve the right to refuse your travel privileges.

## **Uniform Policy**

Uniforms are the property of the LCHS band program. If damaged, it is the students responsibility for repair or replacement costs. That being said treat uniforms with the utmost care so we have them and we look good, simply put.

#### Marching band uniform:

- -Hat (Provided)
- -Shoes (Not provided) \$30 new \$10 used (if available)

- -Black Socks
- \*hair should be up and all jewelry (unless medical bracelets) should not be worn or covered up.

#### Guard:

-All your attire is provided and is part of your guard fees.

#### **Concert Attire:**

The dress for most concerts will be what is called "Sunday Dress."

#### Guys:

Dress with slacks or khakis (No jeans), a button up shirt and tie is expected, suit jackets are acceptable as well as vests or any other formal wear. No hats, jeans, tennis shoes or sandals.

#### Ladies:

Dress with skirts, dresses, or dress pants that are no shorter than knee length. Tops should be modest and conservative in nature (nothing exposed below the neck line and with sleeves). Jewelry may be worn but should also be modest. Shoes must be closed toe, no higher than 1 inch heels. Flats are preferable.

<u>Concert Black:</u> Occasionally I will ask for concert black attire. This includes black shoes and attire for ladies, and black button ups, black shoes, and black slacks for gentlemen.

Inappropriate attire or misuse of any uniform will result in the dismissal from the event. As well as, receiving a zero for the day and possibly failing the class.

## Attendance Policy

Attendance at all rehearsals and performances is mandatory. If you fail to show up to these and your excuse is not excusable or non-legitimate, you will fail this class. If it is an ensemble that does not receive a grade, I will remove you from the ensemble. In other words, be there and don't be late. If you are sick I need a doctor's note, if it's an emergency I need some form of acceptable and official documentation. You made a commitment to myself and your peers to be in the band. See it through. A chain is only as strong as its weakest link.

## **Expenses**

#### What are Expenses for?

Any high school band is a very expensive operation. Including but not limited to: instruments and instrument repair, travel expenses, uniforms and uniform maintenance, music, expenses to musical organizations, festival and contest entry expenses, and staff. To cover those expenses we constantly need parent/sponsor volunteers. We are entirely self-funded and anything we do we have to raise money for. We do numerous fund raisers, and we request that band membership help cover those expenses. Many band programs around us have budgets well into 6 figures. We only break 5! As well as many programs around us have band student expenses ranging from \$600 - \$800+.

Some of our biggest fundraisers come from parent/sponsor/student involvement. The more parent involvement into the program the less out of pocket expense there are for the students. We do work on a point system please see the student grading and point section on page 11.

#### The base band expense for every member of band is \$165.

## Grading and Points

Grading for this class is based on the following factors:
Attendance to rehearsals and performances
Participation (in class and performances)
Tests
5 Points (for band service)

#### What are Points for?

Due to the band program being completely self-funded we rely heavily on the involvement of Family members. Band expenses cover roughly 10% of our annual budget. The Remaining 90% is done through various fundraisers. Most of this revenue is brought in from the concession stands at football games, which requires 30 volunteers to run effectively!! We cannot function without the involvement of our parents and sponsors!

Each Band member is responsible for 10 Points
(5 points on their own, 5 points from a parent or sponsor) these are the service portion of their academic grade for the year.

1 hour of service = 1 point

#### How students can earn points:

- Participating in band related activities outside of Marching or Concert Band.
- Reaching fundraising goals.
- Taking on additional responsibility/leadership roles.
- Other avenues as deemed appropriate by the director.

#### How Parents/Sponsors/Boosters can earn points:

- Volunteering to work in concession stands/ fundraisers
- Chaperoning on trips/games/competitions
- Helping with moving /building/maintaining equipment during the season
- Helping haul trailers.
- Securing corporate/local sponsorships
- Attending Band Booster meetings

# If the 5 booster/sponsor points cannot be met, I request that the student band expense is raised by \$50.

\*Please note that the student's grade will only be affected if they do not complete their own 5 points. \*

## **Fundraisers**

Over the course of the year students and band boosters have numerous fundraisers. Here is a list of events we do and you will participate in:

**Fruit Sale:** This is a student ran fundraiser that goes through the school. This fundraiser takes place in the fall of each year and can raise quite a bit of money to purchase much needed supplies for the music program.

**Concessions:** The band boosters run concessions for all home football games and for other events during the school year. The majority of our revenue for traveling, purchasing equipment, and anything we do with the band comes from running these concession stands.

Other Fundraisers: There will be ample fundraisers throughout the year that will be led both through the school and the Band Booster organization. Students have the opportunity to raise money for their own band expenses on some of the fundraisers. More information will be available about these as the year progresses.

Other Fundraisers included: Sonic Cards, Car Washes, Strawberry's, Cookbooks, Craft Fairs, Frito Lay Picnics, Restaurant Partnerships Nights, and many more.

It is very important that we raise funds as we are completely self-funded. The more money we can find and raise, the more things we are able to do and purchase for you! And of course, the more places we can go.
